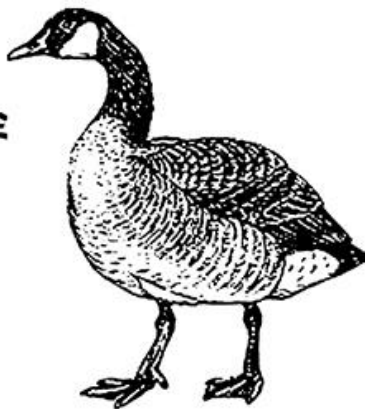

Local and Regional Weather Report

November's special days are All Hallows (1st Nov), All Souls (2nd Nov) and St Martins (11th Nov). We may get St Lukes little summer (Oct 18th) or we could have St Martins little summer if the weather is warm on the 11th November. If St Martins is fair dry and cold, the winter will not last long. The saying is "If the wind is in the South-East at Martinmas it remains there till after Christmas" but "Wind in the north-west at Martinmas, severe winter to come". Also, if on November 1st (All Hallows) "the beech nut is dry", we shall have a hard winter, but "if the nut be wet and not light", we may expect a wet winter. The weather on November 10th (Martinmas Eve) is supposed to indicate that for rest of the winter. Finally, the well-known rhyme "If ducks do slide at Hallowtide, At Christmas they will swim; If ducks do swim at Hallowtide, At Christmas they will slide".

September weather was very unsettled and warm, with some above average temperatures and persistent rain. Nearly 9 days out of 10 saw cloudy weather or rain, but only 5 days out of 10 were sunny or had sunny intervals. Rainfall: Local 175 mm, Regional 152.7 mm = 52% above normal
Minimum temperatures: Local 16 deg, Regional 10.1deg = +0.8 deg
Maximum Temperatures: Local 24 deg, Regional 17.1 deg = +0.1 deg

What were the weather forecasts for September? BBC said generally warmer, drier and calmer weather. Netweather forecast said more settled conditions with more sunshine and warmer temperatures. Both wrong. What do they say about November? Met office says longer spells of dry weather, with overnight frosts and fog. BBC says lower temperatures but drier and calmer conditions. Can we add any more from the weather lore forecast? There was a full moon in October without frost, so no frost till full moon in November (15th). The Jet Stream forecast at the start of November shows it across the north of the UK with low pressure and winds from the south west. This indicates unsettled and warm but probably wet weather. **Mike Head**

NOVEMBER 2024 FOOTPATHS REPORT FOR ENMORE

1 The word “footpaths” include bridleways and there appear to be an equal amount of both in our Parish.

2 Enmore resident and Rider, Eleanor Davies, has made a great suggestion – organising a tidy-up of the Bridleways and Footpaths (Rights of Way) similar to Enmore’s successful Litter Pick. Volunteers would bring their loppers and secateurs to clear accessible paths. Where she used to live, horse riders would regularly get together to tackle a particular path, and not only was it sociable, but it worked well.

3 Removal of Debris from the above exercise appeared problematic, so I contacted our new Warden, John Melrose. He used to guide Volunteer Days and said, subject to Landowner consent, much was either mulched, burnt on site or added to a handy pile to be disposed of later.

4 As noted above, we, including Goathurst and others, now have a new Area Warden (there are 7 for all Somerset). He is responsive to our problems (mainly path quality, particularly contractors cropping over paths) and picks up any reports left on the Explore Somerset Interactive Map website. It isn’t easy to do at my advanced age, but should be easy for younger, computer-literate people. The new warden has mentioned that I might be able to train those who are struggling with online issues, but I am not sure!?! But please contact me anytime. 671742

5 Somerset Footpaths need more Volunteers, like Strimmer Luke Manning and me. If you are interested, you may like to explore Somerset Council’s roles of Adopt-a-Path or Ease of Use Surveyor – here are the Links for applying online.

ENMORE PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Your Parish Council did not meet in October. Our next meeting will be held on Tuesday 5th November, starting at 7.30 pm in Enmore Memorial Hall. The meetings page of the website will have links to the agenda and to the finance report several days in advance. All meetings are open to the public.

Our new road signs have been installed as the first stage in the upgrading of signage and speed limit changes. We still await renewed markings on the road surface and the flashing lights to limit speeds past the school to 20 mph when needed for pupils' safety. We understand that Somerset Council outsources the work to various different firms so the timing of work is not always synchronised. On past form the outstanding work will be started as soon as this update has been sent to the magazine!

Repairs are currently being undertaken to one of the speed indicator devices, resulting from damage by a high and wide vehicle. It should be back in service soon.

Our budget for the 2025/26 financial year will have a preliminary discussion at the November meeting and be finalised with a request for next year's parish precept at the January meeting. If you have suggestions as to how your Parish Council can do more to improve the quality of life in Enmore please let us know. Much can be achieved with volunteers and grants, when available, but there is usually some cost for the Parish Council, which should be allowed for in our budget and which may require a higher level for the parish element of Council Tax. But small and low-cost improvements still make a difference - please contribute your ideas.

New Homes are a success

Most of our orphans have gone to their new homes and we start to hear how they are getting on. A landowner who had a Little Owl release in his woods, was amused to see that one of them has decided that a Barn Owl box he had built and put up, will do nicely thank you! Slightly palatial for such a small bird, the Little Owl seems very content and we hope that maybe, with such a posh house, he may soon get a mate.

Our family of badgers are busy excavating their artificial sett and preparing for the winter with bedding being taken in. We are so lucky that our landowners very often continue to feed the juveniles through the winter as these orphans have no parents teaching them how to survive through the winter.

Fortunately, we have been able to find enough release sites for our Tawnies as we always end up with quite a collection – known as a parliament of owls. Happy to live alongside humans, it means that when the owlets are in trouble, they will usually be seen and reported. They are content to be reared together – as we have some large aviaries for them.

Not every rescued orphan is easy to find a home for. For the first time we had a Sika calf brought in for rehab. They are very similar to our Red deer but as an invasive species, it means we can't release her back into the wild. She was very pretty and enjoyed being reared with a Roe fawn for company. It was important for us to find a suitable home where we were sure she would be looked after. We were lucky to find a home she could go to. But sadly, she suddenly took a turn for the worse and died. It is so hard for the carers who have spent so much time caring for the animals and become very emotionally involved. Happily, the juvenile Roe has been released now so will have other Roe for company.

We are forever grateful to people who offer release sites for our orphans. Without having homes for them to go to we wouldn't be able to rear them. If you think you may have a suitable release site for birds

or mammals, we would love to hear from you. It's the final piece in our jigsaw of caring for wildlife – absolutely crucial. Do contact Charlotte Wroe, our Wildlife Release Co-Ordinator, if you think you can help on charlotte.wroe@secretworld.org . She will come and survey and let you know how you can help us.

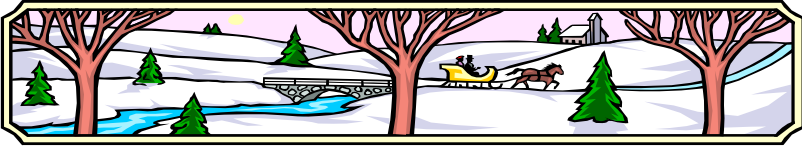

I drove for miles down country lanes (nothing new there!) and stopped to ask a lady where I was headed. Unfortunately, English was not her native tongue so I struggled to understand. The next person I asked was in a car who replied that he had “no idea”. A third driver most kindly tried to explain the route but I was confused after the third turn left! Realising my confusion this kind lady offered to turn her car around and lead me to the main road which she subsequently did together with another motorist, also lost, tagging on behind us! She didn’t stop to be thanked when she turned off but I waved and shouted my thanks out of the window. I was greatly touched by her kindness and prayed she would receive a blessing of some kind!

There is a wonderful Proverb in the Bible which suggests that we should not “lean on [our] own understanding, but in all ways trust God and he will make straight your paths”. I had tried to figure out the way; I had tried Satnav without success; I had asked strangers and having had to admit that I was unable to understand, submitted myself to the kindness of God shown through this generous lady.

God reminds us that we should trust him at all times and even when doing so requires us to venture into unknown territory. The end result is often better than that which we had originally planned. The Willis Monument: By the time you receive this magazine, the restoration should be complete, after a nine-year saga of concern! The PCC are truly grateful to the Quantock Landscape Partnership and St Andrew's Conservation Trust, without whose support this would not have been possible. Sally Strachey's Historic Conservation have done an amazing job over the past month and the full conservation report will be available for all to view in due course.

A special 'unveiling' event will follow, possibly in the spring, as it may have to remain wrapped to enable the mortar to 'cure' sufficiently over the winter months.

We are also extremely grateful to Edward Strachan and the staff at Halswell for all their support in storing the column for the past 4 years and for their patience in facilitating many visits by conservators, before it was eventually brought 'home' and re-erected.

You may be interested to know that the 18th century Willis Monument has also benefitted the 21st century SAPP project! Lead and iron from within has been recycled raising funds towards our planned toilet and kitchenette extension!

'Any old iron' ...AND electrical cable! Many thanks to all who donated rusty old metal and pipes (and even bent tent pegs, rusty screws etc!) for metal reclamation in aid of the SAPP fund. The last collection raised £67.48! We are extending the 'service' to include any redundant electrical cabling (just cut off the plug). Please let Brenda know if you have any items, big or small, she will arrange to collect and take for reclamation. Old household appliances and car batteries

are also welcomed! The pennies soon mount up, well over £80 already!
